Huntington University/ Laurentian University graduates of the *B.A 3 year Concentration or B.A. 3 year Combined Concentration or, B.A. 4 year Specialization or B.A 4 year Combined Specialization* seeking admission to the Diploma in Activation Coordinator/ Gerontology are covered by this Agreement.

Huntington University/ Laurentian University graduates with a G.P.A of 2.8 (70%) or higher will receive sixteen (16) full college course credits provided they present the following at time of admission:

- 1) an official copy of their degree from Laurentian University
- 2) proof the following electives have been completed:
  - 1) ANTRO 2016: Human Biological Variation: Adaptations and Health
  - 2) GERO 3306: Dementia Studies
  - 3) GERO 3327: Mental Health & Aging
  - 4) RLST 3327: Ethical Issues for the elderly

IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT THE ABOVE 4 COURSES ARE TAKEN PRIOR TO STARTING AT GEORGE BROWN COLLEGE

### Rational for courses chosen based on Gap Analysis conducted:

GBC: GERT 1160 Introduction to Biology of Aging

It will be a prerequisite for admission to the diploma program. A Laurentian student must take the following course as part of their elective package. LAU:ANTRO 2016 Human Biological Variation

GBC: GBC GERT 1033 Intro to Gerontology> LAU:GERO 1015 Intro to Gerontology required first year course

GBC: GBC GERT 1035 Alzheimer's disease and Related Disorders. It will be a prerequisite for admission to the diploma program. A Laurentian student must take the following course as part of their elective package> LAU:GERO Caring for people with Dementia.

GBC: GSSC1058: Introduction to Psychology> LAU:PSYCH 1105: Introduction to Psychology. Required first year course.

GBC: GER 2016/ GERT 2009 GERT 2018/ GERT 2011 Field Seminar/ Field Practice 111/1V> LAU:GERO 3015 Critical skills for the Gerontologist, GERO 3107 Internship in Gerontology. All students coming Laurentian will complete a GBC first year placement and seminar course

GBC: HUMN 2001: Values and Ethics. It will be a prerequisite for admission to the diploma program that a Laurentian student must take the following course as part of their elective package. LAU:RSLT3327: Ethical Issues for the Elderly

GBC: GERT 1014: Psychogeriatrics: It will be a prerequisite for admission to the diploma program that a Laurentian student must take the following course as part of their elective package LAU:GERO 3327: Mental Health Problems in Later Life.

SWK 2001 GROUP PROCESS: a variety of electives presented to substantiate this course being covered

\* COMM 1007 and COMP1082 College English and Computer Skills. Must provide proof of equivalency and take an English assessment test as part of GBC admissions process.
